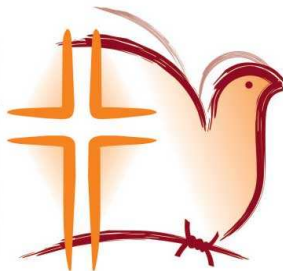


JPIC Update
